## Pipeline work in Alnwickhill/Liberton area

### What work is Scottish Water doing?

We are installing new pipelines as part of the Edinburgh Drinking Water Project. The pipelines will take the clear, fresh drinking water from Glencorse Water Treatment Works into the existing water supply network in Edinburgh. The twin pipeline splits at Damhead. One leg will connect into existing pipe work going to Fairmilehead and the other leg will be tunnelled under the City Bypass to connect into the network at Alnwickhill. There are also two smaller pipes which take sludge (a bi-product of the water treatment process) away from the Glencorse site.

### What can I expect to see?

The majority of the work will take place in agricultural land. Please see the map on the following page which shows the pipeline route in the Alnwickhill/Liberton area.

### You may see:

- temporary pipe storage areas;
- trenches being excavated; and
- pipes being moved into the trenches.

### Traffic Management

Alnwickhill Road will be closed for a period of 3 weeks commencing the end of July 2010. Diversion routes will be clearly signposted and road users will be given advanced notice.

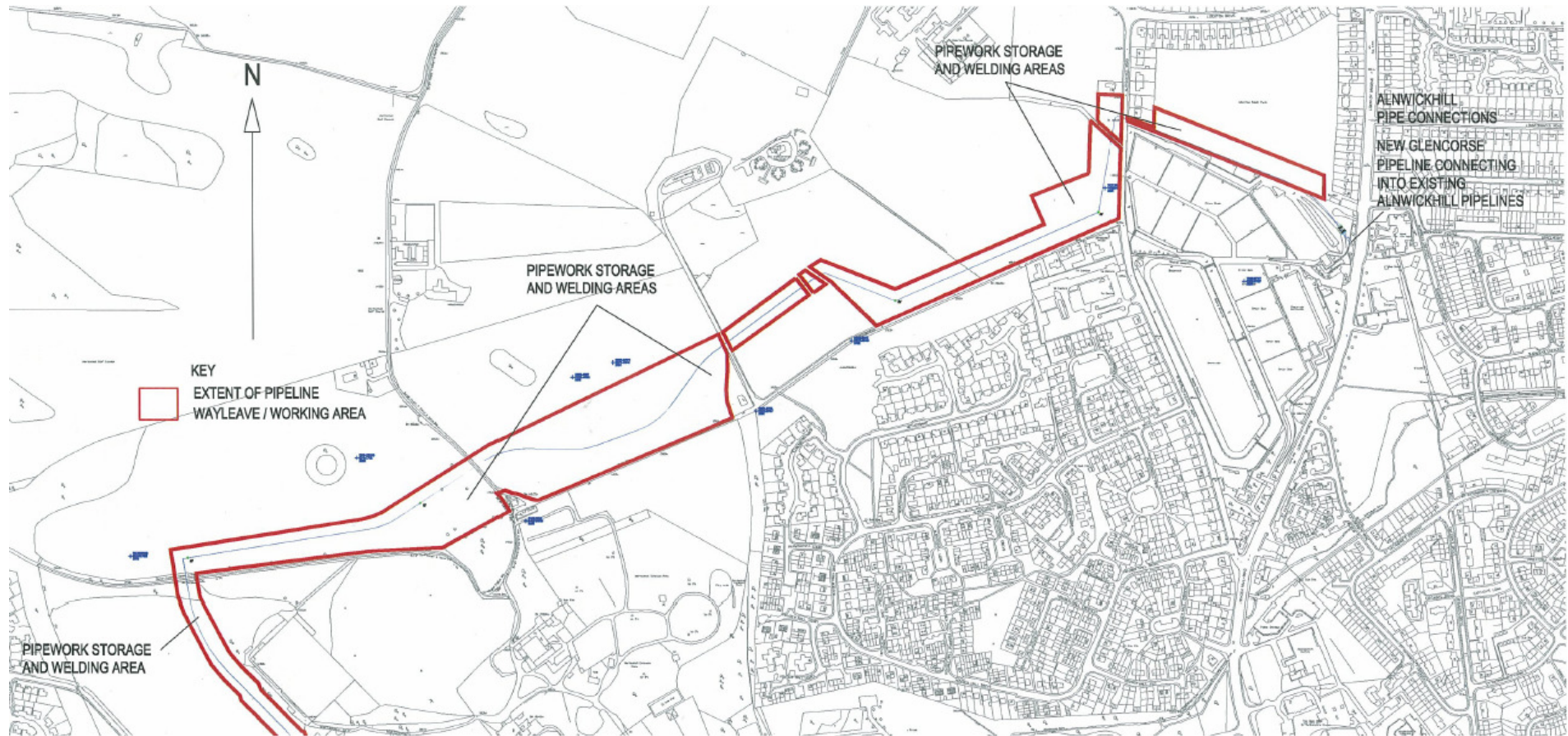
We are actively working and reaching agreement with Local Authority Roads Department and public transport to manage traffic movements and road closures. We also appreciate the assistance of community representatives and residents in minimising the disruption.

### When will the work be completed?

We will finish laying pipes in the Alnwickhill area in early 2011 and the final reinstatement (grass seeding etc.) will be completed in Spring 2011.
